




Writer's Corner

The Department of Microbiology at Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women (Autonomous), conducted its Association Inauguration, "MICROECLECTIC 2025" on 18th August, 2025 in the Golden Jubilee Seminar Hall. The Chief Guest of the event was Ms. Meenanarmadha. M, Senior Manager, Aggregate reporting, Pfizer India.

The program began with the prayer by Ms. Sherien Fathima from II B.Sc Microbiology followed by the welcome address by Ms. Faiza Naaz from II M.Sc Applied Microbiology. The department secretary, Ms. Nowrin from III B.Sc Microbiology delivered the annual report of the academic year 2024-2025. The Vice principal, Dr. Firdouse Jahan, welcomed the chief guest with a box of dry fruits.

The inaugural address was delivered by our esteemed Chief Guest, Ms. Meenanarmadha M., on the theme "Overview of Pharmacovigilance and Career Opportunities for Microbiologists in the Pharmaceutical Industry."

In her address, she elaborated on the diverse career prospects available for microbiologists, highlighting key roles such as Clinical Research Associate, Drug Safety Auditor, Data Manager, Regulatory Affairs Specialist, Medical Writer, and Clinical Study Coordinator within the domain of clinical research. She also outlined the requisite educational qualifications for these professional pathways.

Furthermore, she emphasized the expanding career avenues for microbiologists in the pharmaceutical sector, including opportunities as Medical Communication Specialists, Contract Research Organization (CRO) professionals, Scientific Journal Contributors, Freelancers, and Pharmaceutical Advertising Consultants.

Ms. Meenanarmadha provided an insightful overview of the drug development and dispatch process, which broadly comprises three stages: the Discovery Phase, Clinical Research, and Post-Marketing Surveillance. She particularly underscored the significance of the post-marketing phase, during which drugs are introduced into the market, necessitating the recruitment of professionals for data entry, as well as the critical role of medical writers in documenting safety profiles. She also touched upon the issue of drug resistance and underscored the importance of pharmacovigilance in ensuring patient safety and therapeutic efficacy.

In addition, she systematically delineated the stages and timelines of drug development while presenting a comprehensive overview of pharmacovigilance processes, including case receipt, case triage, case processing, medical review, and regulatory submission. She further shared insights into various specialized courses in pharmacovigilance, encouraging students to enhance their competencies and explore career opportunities within the industry. Importantly, she highlighted the growing role of artificial intelligence in pharmacovigilance and urged students to integrate technological skills with scientific expertise in order to remain competitive in the evolving pharmaceutical landscape.



After the inaugural address, a badge distribution ceremony was held. The office bearers of the department were Nowrin Femina.
