Over 50+ students from 2nd and 3rd year actively participated to acquire knowledge, aimed at empowering individuals in the field of solar and battery storage technologies. On the same day, the students also visited the factory site "Shizen Energy " at Thiruvallur. This programme was organized by our alumna Ms. Sakthi Maheshwari.S (2021-2024 Batch). The primary aim of this workshop and Industrial visit was to provide students with practical exposure to advanced battery energy storage systems and their significance in the renewable energy sector.

The program commenced with a welcome note by Mr. MEC Shanlee, Technical Director of MEC Solar, who introduced the event and provided an overview of the organisation's objectives. He emphasized

the purpose of the workshop and highlighted its relevance to the revolving energy landscape. Mr. Shanlee also introduced the esteemed speakers of the day, setting a structured and engaging tone for the sessions ahead.

The primary objective of this workshop was to provide students with a practical understanding of various electrical appliances through live demonstrations. The session aimed to familiarize students with the internal components, working principles and safety measures associated with commonly used electrical devices.

Students were given the opportunity to observe and learn from live demonstrations using actual equipment. The instructors effectively used real-time equipment to explain each concept in detail.

Appliances such as fuse boxes ,charge controllers and solar panels were demonstrated to help the students, visualize their operation and understand the common issues.

The resource persons delivered the complex concepts that were broken down into simple explanations using demonstrations making it easy for all students to understand the content easily.

Through this workshop, the students have gained valuable practical knowledge and technical awareness about commonly used electrical appliances and observed the internal structure and working principles of household appliances like fans, mixers and bulbs.

The students were more aware of basic safety practices and the importance of proper handling of electrical devices , which is essential for both academic growth and future professional environment.

This program was conducted in collaboration with the ICT Academy Trainers, Guindy, Chennai, and was specially designed for the final-year students of the department, with over 20 enthusiastic participants.



The main objective of this workshop was to provide the students with an in-depth understanding of mobile technologies, focusing on both hardware and software aspects, along with a futuristic vision of the evolving mobile industry.

A fury flung across the skies.

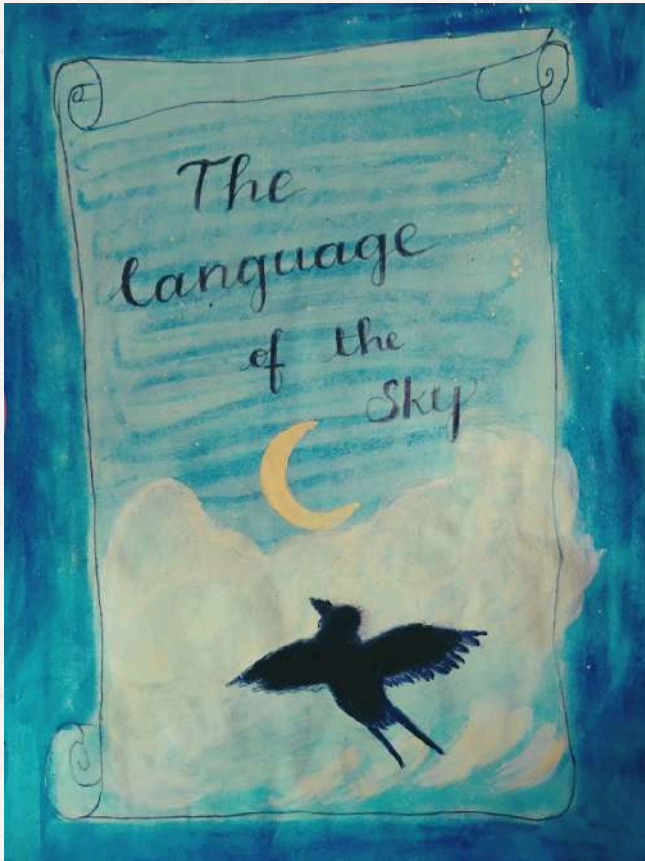
At night she hums in silent grace,
