





DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE (AN)



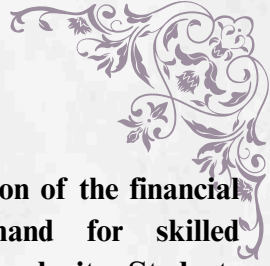


DEPARTMENT OF B.COM CORPORATE SECRETARYSHIP AND INFORMATION SYSTEMS MANAGEMENT (AN)

The Department of B.Com Corporate Secretaryship and Information Systems Management of Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women organized a seminar on the topic “Opportunities in the Financial Industry and Investor Advisory Segments” on March 20, 2025, in the Seminar Hall at 2:30 p.m. The event was attended by faculty members and students.

The seminar aimed to educate students about the growing career prospects in the finance sector. The session was led by two esteemed resource persons—Mrs. Sudha Padmanaban and Mr. Rajinikanth R., who shared valuable insights into the evolving financial landscape.






The discussion focused on the expansion of the financial industry and the increasing demand for skilled professionals due to rising market complexity. Students were introduced to diverse career paths in finance, emphasizing steady growth opportunities and specializations beyond traditional degrees such as M.B.A. or M.Com. Alternative certifications and courses like IRDAI, NISM, and SEBI, as well as higher education options such as M.Sc. in Actuarial Science and Economics programs at IIT Kanpur and IIT Madras, were also discussed.


Key professional roles including Fund Manager, Insurance Adviser, and Equity Specialist were explored. The speakers highlighted the essential qualities sought by companies, such as a positive attitude, relevant skill set, and strong domain knowledge. Additionally, the South Zone (ASO) Champion's League Program was introduced to encourage leadership development among students.





A vital segment of the session focused on financial planning, covering topics like inflation, declining bank interest rates, and investment principles such as the Rules of 74, 114, 144, and 70. The concept of “Earn While You Learn” was also promoted through a four-step onboarding process, encouraging students to gain hands-on experience alongside their academic journey.

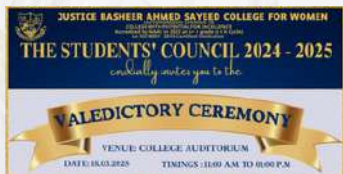
