## NATIONAL SEMINAR ON “MATHEMATICS: THE GATEWAY TO THE EMERGING TRENDS OF TECHNOLOGY”



The Department of Mathematics successfully organized a National Seminar for the academic year 2025–2026 on 10th September 2025 at the Golden Jubilee Seminar Hall. The seminar, themed “Mathematics – The Gateway to the Emerging Trends of Technology,” emphasized the vital role of mathematics as the foundation of scientific and technological innovation.

### Inauguration

The program commenced at 9:00 a.m., hosted by Rahmath Nisha, Department Secretary (III B.Sc. Mathematics). The session began with a prayer by Afrin Al Majedha, followed by a translation by Afrah Yumn, both from the same class. Mrs. Fathima Azher, Head of the Department, extended a warm Welcome Address.

Dr. (Mrs.) Amthul Azeez, Principal and Correspondent, delivered the Presidential Address, highlighting the ten different kinds of intelligence individuals possess and inspiring students to identify and develop their unique strengths.

He also explained how physics principles, including mechanics, optics, and thermodynamics, foster problem-solving abilities, logical reasoning, and an understanding of real-world phenomena that can inspire innovative computational solutions.

The presentation underscored that such interdisciplinary knowledge not only enhances technical competence but also prepares students for impactful careers in emerging fields such as AI, data science, robotics and computational modelling.



Dr. N. Indrajith also emphasized the importance of stress management and introduced students to simple exercises and techniques to relieve stress, highlighting the need for a balanced approach to learning alongside academic rigor. Students from both Mathematics and Physics (No's: 40) were benefitted greatly, as the event encourages them to explore interdisciplinary connections between the two fields, thereby equipping them for advanced studies and diverse career opportunities.
