My experience as a show director has been deeply fulfilling, particularly my tenure at *Super Singer* on Star Vijay Television. For over sixteen years, this iconic show became a platform that launched the careers of more than 1,000 talented playback singers.

Another highlight of my career has been the creation of the reality show *Cooku with Comali*. The show, a unique blend of culinary challenges and comedy, broke conventional barriers in cooking shows by combining humor with high culinary standards. It revitalized the non-fiction space and opened doors for emerging comedians and entertainers in the Tamil film industry.

Under my guidance, *Media Masons* has grown from a focused television production house into a dynamic, 360-degree media organization. Beyond *Super Singer* and *Cooku with Comali*, we have produced acclaimed shows such as *Samayal Samayal with Venkatesh Bhat*, *Mr & Mrs Chinnathirai*, *Kitchen Superstars*. These programs won multiple honors at the Vijay Television Awards and Blacksheep Digital Awards. Top Cooku Dupe Cooku was crowned Most Favourite Non Fiction Show at the Sun Kudumbam Awards.

Today, *Media Masons* stands at the forefront of media innovation, offering end-to-end services including television production, digital storytelling, influencer marketing, ad film production, and event management. We have embraced the growing demand for online entertainment, producing engaging non-fiction and reality content for platforms like YouTube. Our general entertainment channel boasts nearly 2 million subscribers, while our Facebook and Instagram presence exceeds 800,000 followers combined.

I am truly grateful for the opportunities and experiences that have shaped my career. I hope my journey inspires fellow alumnae to pursue their passions with determination, creativity, and courage. Together, let us continue to support and empower each other as we build meaningful careers and create lasting impact.
