**23. Courses in which student assessment of teachers is introduced and the action taken on student feedback**

Assessment of teachers is made by the students in all the courses. The IQAC prepares a schedule for the collection of feedback from the students. The filled-in feedback forms are analyzed by a data analyst for compilation. The assessment of each teacher is kept confidential and the Principal discusses it individually. The feedback was collected on 24<sup>th</sup> of February 2010 for the Forenoon and Afternoon Sessions.

**24. Feedback from stakeholders**

Parents have the opportunity of meeting the teachers at PTA meetings that are conducted twice a year, once in every semester. The parents are required to fill feedback forms prepared and distributed by the IQAC. The Parent-Teacher meeting was held on 16.10.2009 and on 26.3.2010 in the odd and even semesters respectively. Our Placement Officer receives feedback from employers who come to recruit our students for various jobs.

**26. Computerization of administration and the process of admissions and examination results, issue of certificates.**

The College offices of the Forenoon Session and the Afternoon Session, the Office of the Controller of the Examinations and all the departments are computerized.

The entire admission procedure is computerized. Data from all the application forms received for admission into various courses is entered and merit lists are generated to facilitate admission.

Examination results are declared online every semester and students can take a printout of their results. As all examinations related information is computerized, the mark sheets are issued to the students on time.

**27. Increase in the infrastructural facilities**

All the computer labs were upgraded with latest facilities. In the Department of Computer Science, Lab-IV was constructed and Lab-III was installed with additional computer terminals. Due to the additional section in B.C.A., B.Sc. Computer science and B.Sc. ISM, one floor was taken over from the Vocational Training Institute.

Under the scheme of promotion of basic science research, the research labs of the Departments of Zoology and Human Science were renovated. The laboratories of the Chemistry Department and the Department of Plant Biology and Plant Biotechnology were also renovated.

**28. Technology upgradation**

- LCD projectors were provided to all the PG departments to enable use of technology in teaching and learning methods.
- The Autolib software was installed in the library to automate the working process.

**29. Computer and internet access and training to teachers, non-teaching and students**

- All the faculty members and the students have access to internet facility. The students and staff use the air-conditioned online information zone in the library and avail the printing facilities provided.
- 2 Teaching staff, 1 non-teaching staff and 21 students underwent computer training to upgrade their knowledge at the Centre for Women's Studies.

**30. Financial aid to students**

During the year 2009-10, a total of Rs.41.47 lakhs (Forty one lakhs forty seven thousand rupees) was disbursed as scholarship to the students of the Forenoon and Afternoon Sessions. A total of 715 students in the Forenoon Session and 336 students in the Afternoon Session were benefitted. Apart from this, students apply for Government BC/SC/ST scholarships. Students admitted under the sports quota, are given fee waiver throughout the period of their study. In this academic year, totally 19 students were given full fee waiver.

**31. Activities and support from the Alumni Association**

The Alumni Reunion was held on the 27<sup>th</sup> of March 2010. Nearly 1200 alumni participated. The Guests of Honour were our alumni Dr. Latha Pillai, Pro Vice Chancellor of IGNOU, Miss. Sivasankari, the eminent Tamil writer and Mrs. Bhuvana Natarajan, a Sahitya Academy Award winner. Dr. Latha Pillai released the Alumni Achievers Book and the Correspondent received the first copy of the book. The alumni reiterated their commitment to the development of the institution.

**32. Activities and support from the Parent -Teacher Association**

Parents meet the teachers on a designated day every semester to follow up on the progress made by their children. The meeting usually takes place towards the end of the semester and before the End Semester exams. Parents interact with teachers and find out about the performance of their wards. The PTA meeting for the odd semester was held on 16.10.2009 and for the even semester it was held on 26.3.2010.

### 33. **Health Services**

The Health Clinic is managed by two full time medical practitioners, one for the Forenoon Session and the other for the Afternoon Session. The students undergo regular medical check-up. The doctors attend to the various medical and general health problems of the students and staff. In case of an emergency, the doctors administer first aid and take the student to nearby hospitals.

Every year, the Fathima Akthar Health Club organizes medical camps, workshops and awareness seminars for the students, the teaching and non-teaching staff.

Our college is always in the forefront in the field of Sports and Games. Physical Education enhances personal growth, well-being and improves the overall personality of the students. Our institution gives importance to both curricular and extra-curricular activities.

- The Department of Zoology in association with the University of Madras celebrated the Bicentenary Celebrations of Charles Darwin entitled ‘Darwin-200’.

## SECTION C

### **Outcomes achieved at the end of the year**

- An innovative course - Advanced Postgraduate Diploma in Sports Psychology was started in the academic year 2009-10.
- Nine add-on courses funded by the UGC were introduced.
- Interdisciplinary Non-major Electives were offered to undergraduate students in the III and IV semesters.
- A fortnightly online newsletter LIVE WIRE was started for students and staff of our college to connect, interact and share ideas and information with peers and with other college students and staff
- The Research Cell RESCON was started with 12 staff members to encourage and facilitate research and also to document the research undertaken by the staff and students.
- The Entrepreneur Development Cell was started to encourage and enhance the students’ entrepreneurial skills.
- Consumer Club was started to emphasize the rights and responsibility of a Young consumer.
- Three minor projects funded by the UGC were completed.
- 52 workshops/seminars were conducted to improve competency levels of students.
- The increased enrolment in courses has given rise to the establishment of a new computer lab (Lab IV)
- An amount of Rs.41.5 lakhs (approx.) disbursed as Trust Scholarship.

- 401 students placed through campus interviews.
- Library software (Autolib) installed to facilitate library operations.
- The Online Information Zone facilitates online reference for staff and students.
- In the 28<sup>th</sup> State Level Silambam Tournament our College student won II place.
- In Archery, our student won the III place in the National Level tournament held at Raipur.
