THE EMBLEM



The Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women, (formerly known as the “S.I.E.T. Women’s College”) was started in 1955 with the noble aim of imparting higher education to women. The visionary founder of the College, Mr. Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed and his wife, Hajani Fathima Akhtar, designed the emblem of the College with the motto ‘Learning is Light from God’ seeking to reflect the values desired to be inculcated in the students of the College.

Learning or Knowledge is a Divine gift, which endows a woman with grace, goodness, grandeur of vision and empowers her to make the world a better place to live in.

The emblem is in the shape of a coat-of-arms divided into four quarters - all four unified by the circle holding an open book. The symbols in the four sections indicate the various facets of the personality to be developed in every young woman student who enters the portals of this College. The moon and the star are symbolic of Islam, which proclaims the Oneness of God, peace and submission to His will. The balance reminds us of the need for justice and fair play, integrity and equality. The coconut tree is unique for its multi-utilitarian purpose. This is symbolic of the education and the knowledge imparted which will bear fruit at all times in one’s life. The Lotus, the National flower of India, with its myriad petals all arranged together so beautifully, stands for integration. Students who come from varied backgrounds, belonging to different castes and creeds, are all united harmoniously in the common objective of learning.

At the heart of the emblem, unifying all four is an Open Book. All the qualities described above are inculcated in the students of this institution, through the means of education and enlightenment of all kinds. Academic excellence goes hand in hand with the development of a sound personality.

5. THE GREAT VISIONARIES



**THE HON'BLE Mr. JUSTICE BASHEER AHMED SAYEED,
M.A., B.L.**

Born in 1900 at his maternal grand parent's home at No.18, Arundale Street, Mylapore, Madras, his early education was in a village school near Siruvadi in the Tindivanam District. He had his elementary and high school education in Crane School of American Arcot Mission, Tindivanam. He graduated from the Madras Christian College, then situated at Parry's opposite to the Madras High Court and his special subject was Political Science.

He received his degree in Law in 1923. He joined the "Khilafat Movement" organized by the Ali brothers (Maulana Mohammed Ali and Maulana Shoukath Ali) in 1924. Later, he joined the Congress Committee under the leadership of Mr. C.R. Das of Bengal and Sriman Srinivasa Iyengar of Madras. Till his death, he continued to be a Congressman. From 1921 to 1949 he was an active politician. During this period he took part in the "Khilafat Movement" and the "Non Co-operation Movement" as part of the Indian freedom struggle.

From the year 1924 to 1926, he was the District Congress Secretary and served as a member of the All India Congress Committee until 1946. In 1926, he contested the Corporation elections and was elected, in fact, as the youngest Councillor of the Corporation of Madras, against many odds. He evinced keen interest in the social, cultural and educational upliftment of the Muslim community of South India. He was for a long time associated with the Syndicate of each of the Madras University, Annamalai University, Aligarh Muslim University

and other social organizations in the South India. He was keen on establishing a college for Muslim boys as early as 1946.

As Secretary of the Muslim Educational Association of Southern India, in 1945, he was instrumental in purchasing 31 acres of land at Peters Road, Royapettah with great difficulty. As the Muslim Educational Association of Southern India did not have sufficient funds for this purpose, he negotiated a loan and finally purchased the land. Immediately, he sought affiliation from the University of Madras for a college to be managed by the M.E.A.S.I.

Dr. A. L. Mudaliar, the then Vice-Chancellor of Madras University, was of great assistance to him in the matter of getting affiliation. Finally, the college which he himself named as “The New College” came into existence in 1951 and was inaugurated by the then Governor General of India, Mr. C. Rajagopalachari (Rajaji). Meanwhile, he was elevated to the Bench of the Madras High Court in July 1949. Later on, his talented and dedicated wife Hajani Fathima Akhtar Saheba who was very much interested in the upliftment of Muslim women constantly reminded him that he should start a college for Muslim women.

The immediate reason for her suggestion was the closure of the Government Muslim Women’s College in Madras City. This was a great shock to the Muslim Community and now the time had come to fulfill their dream of starting a College for Women in general and for Muslim Women in particular. A society under the name of “The Southern India Education Trust” was registered on 23rd October, 1951 under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860. Maulana Dr. Abdul Huq and Dr. A.L. Mudaliar and other friends of his in the educational field encouraged him and gave him moral support. The institution, viz., the “S.I.E.T. Women’s College” came into being on 7th of July, 1955.

It was a red letter day in the history of Madras City when Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, the first Prime Minister of India, laid the foundation tablet for the College and the first Education Minister of India Maulana Abul Kalam Azad laid the foundation stone for the First Hall of

Residence which was subsequently named after him. The strength of the College on that day was 110 students with 21 staff members.

It was not an easy job to start a College from scratch, but he, being a highly resourceful and talented person, was dedicated to the cause of education, left no stone unturned in order to improve the financial status of this infant institution. He visited various places in South India, South East Asia, East Africa and the Middle East with a view to collect funds. His contact with the Ministry of Education, Government of India and the U.G.C. helped him to get affiliation for various subjects. During a short span of time, the College developed into a Post Graduate and Research Institution.

The Southern India Education Trust (during his lifetime) was a hub of immense cultural activity in the city of Madras. One dignitary after another, of both National and International repute, visited this Institution due to the efforts and perseverance of this man of vision and action. Some of the dignitaries who have graced this institution with their presence were H.E. Col. Gamel Abdel Nasser, President of the United Arab Republic of Egypt and Syria, King Hussain of Jordan, Shah and Shahbanou of Iran, several Presidents of India such as Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, Dr. Zakir Hussain, Mr. V.V. Giri, Mr. Fakhruddin Ali Ahmed. Ambassadors of various nations including Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, Libya and China have visited this institution. The Founder Mr. Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed is otherwise known as the "Sir Syed of the South". He passed away on the 7th of February, 1984.

The name of the S.I.E.T. Women's College was changed to Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed Women's College with effect from April 1984 to perpetuate the memory of the Founder. Today it is known as the Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women.

In the year 1984, in his memory, the Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed Memorial Matriculation Higher Secondary Boys School was started by the Southern India Education Trust.



HAJANI FATHIMA AKHTAR SAHEBA

The adage “Behind every successful man there is a woman” proves itself in the relationship between the Founder and his better half, Begum Fathima Akhtar. Born in 1918 and brought up in a highly religious and socially committed family, Begum Fathima Akhtar dedicated herself to the cause of women’s education and social service. She was the “spur” who “pricked the sides of the intent” of the Founder, the voice of conscience, who never let him rest and stood beside him all the way as the College was set up, brick by brick and towered from strength to strength.

Begum Fathima Akhtar was the first Muslim woman graduate from the Nawayath Clan. Her early education was in the Corporation School and the Government Hobart High School, Royapettah. She graduated in B.A. Physics in 1941 from Queen Mary’s College, Chennai. In 1957, Begum Fathima Akhtar became the Chairman of the Southern India Education Trust. This entailed the onerous responsibility of leading the Governing Body of the S.I.E.T. Women’s College. She served as a Syndicate member of the Madras University and also a member of the Board of Secondary Education. She held the post of Vice-President of Madras University Women’s Association and the International Women’s Rights Society.

The unique blending of secular education with religious training which is a hallmark of the Southern India Education Trust is a tradition established and carefully nurtured by Begum Fathima Akhtar. She encouraged research in Islamic studies. She was responsible for the setting up of an Arabic Madrasa for Women and Children in Aminjikarai.

This noble soul breathed her last on 3rd March, 1987.
May her soul rest in peace. Ameen.

9. Highlights and Important Events in the History of the S.I.E. Trust & J.B.A.S. College for Women (Autonomous)

- 1951** October 23rd - The Founding of the Southern India Education Trust by the Hon'ble Mr. Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed, M.A.,B.L., in collaboration with seven other prominent Muslims of Madras.
- 1953** Purchase of about 16 acres of land for the College.
- 1954** Halls of Residence established.
- 1955** College established by the Hon'ble Mr. Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed, M.A.,B.L., then Judge, Madras High Court, ably assisted by a few of his colleagues and his wife Mrs. Fathima Akhtar, B.A., in exercise of the Fundamental Rights guaranteed by Articles 26 to 30 of the Constitution of India and repeatedly confirmed by the Supreme Court of India.
- January 22nd - The Foundation Tablet of the College and the First Hall of residence was laid by the then Prime Minister of India, Mr. Jawaharlal Nehru and by Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, the then, Education Minister, Government of India, respectively.
 - July 11th - College started functioning as a Second Grade College.
 - August 6th - Formal Inauguration by Mr Sri Prakasa, the then Governor of Madras. The First Hall of Residence was declared open by Mr. C. Subramaniam, the then Minister of Finance and Education of the Government of Madras. The College buildings, as they had progressed till then, were declared open by Mr Kamaraj, the then Chief Minister of the Government of Madras. The strength of the student body was 110.
- 1956** June - Introduction of NCC
- Foundation stone for the College Swimming Pool was laid by Dr. K.G. Saiyidain, the then Secretary, Ministry of Education, New Delhi.
- 1957** July - The College was upgraded to a First Grade College. The first College Day was celebrated with Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, the then Vice- President of India, presiding over the function.
- 1958** January 27th - The Swimming Pool was inaugurated by Nawab Zain Yar Jung, the then Minister of H.E.H. the Nizam's Government, Hyderabad, with Mr. V.P. Menon, Retired Secretary to the Union Government of India.

- 1959** October 15th - The Auditorium-cum-Theatre was declared open by the then Chief Justice of Madras, the Hon'ble Mr P.V. Rajamannar, under the Presidency of Mr. T.L. Venkatarama Iyer, Retired Judge, Supreme Court of India.
- 1960** April 5th - The Foundation Tablet of the Second Hall of Residence laid by H.E. Col. Gamel Abdel Nasser, President of the United Arab Republic, Cairo, Egypt. The year marks the first graduation of students. The Introduction of the NCC Rifle Corps.
- 1961** July - Introduction of the M.Sc. Home Science Course in Textiles and Clothing. The strength of the student body of the College was 1005.
- 1962** Construction of the Non-Resident Student's Centre was completed.
- 1963** First batch of M.Sc. students appeared for the M.Sc. Home Science final Examination in Textiles and Clothing.
- 1964** January 23rd - Inauguration of the College Alumni Association.
- January 23rd - The Seventh College Day was celebrated under the Presidency of Dr. Zakir Hussain, the then Vice President of India.
 - January 27th - Inauguration of the College UNESCO Club.
 - February 26th - Foundation Tablet for the Child Development Laboratory was laid by the Hon'ble Mr M. Bhakthavatsalam, the then Chief Minister of Madras State.
 - April 4th - Foundation for the Home Management Laboratory was laid by Mrs. Fathima Akhtar, B.A., Chairman, S.I.E.Trust.
 - July 16th - Foundation for the Prayer Hall (Mosque) was laid by Haji Mufti Moulvi Md. Habeebullah Saheb, Chief Khazi to the Government of Madras.
 - December 31st - Completion of the Second Hall of Residence.
- 1965** January 20th - Completion of the 200 meter Turf Track for Track events.
- 1966** January - Completion of the Child Development and Family Relations Laboratory. Completion of the Home Management Laboratory.
- February - Completion of the Prayer Hall (Mosque).
- July - The Mosque was consecrated by Mufti Haji Maulana Atiqur Rahman Usmani Saheb under the Presidency of Mr. Fakhruddin Ali Ahmed, then Union Minister for Agriculture and Irrigation.

- September 9th - Prof. Humayun Kabir, then Union Minister, declared open the Laboratories for Child Development and Family Relations and Home Management.
- 1967** April - Construction of the Mathematics Block and the New Garage Block for the use of the Staff of the College.
- May - Construction of the History Block and the Parlour for the use of people who visit the students residing in the Hostels.
- 1968** August - Construction of additional quarters for students above the Dining Hall of the Second Hall of Residence.
- August 15th - Mr. Jayaprakash Narayan, Sarvodaya leader visited the College.
- October - Unveiling of the portrait of Janab Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed, Founder of the S.I.E. Trust, by H.E. Mr. V.V. Giri, the then Vice-President of India.
- 1969** January 10th - Foundation Tablet for the New Library was laid by their Imperial Majesties Shahanshah Aryamehr and Shahbanou Farah of Iran.
- January 30th - Foundation Tablet was laid for the Open Air Theatre and Auditorium by Dr Douglas Ensminger, the then Representative in India, of the Ford Foundation of U.S.A.
- December - Construction of the Visitor's Parlour completed.
- 1970** January - Construction of the Administration Block with an elevator for 8 persons completed.
- February - Ground Floor and the first floor of the Library were completed.
- March - Unveiling of the portrait of Hajani Fathima Akhtar Saheba, Chairman and Correspondent, S.I.E. Trust and College by Mr. T.P. Meenakshi Sundaranar, the then Vice-Chancellor, Madurai University.
- August 30th - The President of India, H.E. Mr. V.V. Giri declared the College Library open.

21. IDENTITY CARD

Each student of the College is expected to possess an Identity Card with her photograph affixed on it, duly attested by the Principal. The students are advised to wear the card always and use it on the following occasions.

1. To get concession tickets to travel by bus, rail or air.
2. To become a member of the USIS Library, the British Council Library, the Connemara Library and other Public Libraries.
3. For Postal Identity
4. As an Identification Certificate when appearing for examinations.
5. For the receipt of fee concession, scholarships, etc. in the College.
6. Students should carry the Identity Card with them always and produce the card whenever demanded by the Principal or any member of the staff.

Students may obtain their Identity Cards from their respective Heads of the Department.

22. ADMISSION AND WITHDRAWAL

Eligibility

Candidates for admission to the Three Year Degree Courses must have passed Plus Two Examination or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto by the University of Madras.

The upper age limit for admission to UG courses will be 21 (twenty one) years as on 1st July of the respective academic year. However, a relaxation of 5 years is permitted for Differently Abled as per G.O. Ms. No. 239 S.W. dated 3-9-93 and SC/ST/ BC/MBC/DNC candidates and women candidates may be allowed an age relaxation of 3 years beyond 21 years for the admission into U.G. programme.

Admissions to all programmes are done online. Candidates must fill in their particulars in the admission portal. Links will be sent through SMS for admission process after selection, the students will pay the fees online and be admitted in the college.

Withdrawal after Admission

The Student who has paid the admission fees and wishes to discontinue the course for any reason whatsoever, will not be entitled to any remission of fees. All Students, Parents and Guardians should abide by the College rules with regard to admission and withdrawal.

Students who are found to have obtained admission by forged documents or false representations regarding their eligibility or otherwise will be summarily dismissed with forfeiture of all fees paid, and reported to the University and the concerned authorities for necessary action

23. PAYMENT OF FEES

No student will be enrolled or permitted to attend classes until the fees due by her is paid for I and II term. The Principal may fix different dates for different classes for the payment of College Fees within the stipulated date. The students should pay their fees through the online mode. If a student fails to pay the fees due on the date prescribed she will have to pay a fine of Re. 1/- for each working day and if she fails to pay the fees even within the extended date her name will be removed from the rolls. If re-admitted she has to pay a re-admission fee of Rs. 15/- in addition to the fee and fine due by her. Fees once paid will not be refunded.

24. ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES

If a student who has paid her fees and discharged all the obligations to the College, chooses to leave the College, she will be furnished with a Transfer Certificate on application, provided she applies not later than the term following that in which she left the College.

If the application is made after the said date for the transfer certificate i.e. beyond 6 months, Rs. 100/- will be collected for every successive year.

No application for issue of Transfer Certificate will ordinarily be entertained after 5 years of leaving the College.

In the case of students who apply for a duplicate copy of the Transfer Certificate or Conduct Certificate within a period of one year of their leaving the College, a fee of Rs.50/- will be collected and if they apply after a period of one year an additional fee at the rate of Rs. 10/-for each year will be collected for the duplicate copy or copies.

25. FEE CONCESSIONS

From the academic year 2007-2008, tuition fee is waived for U.G. Courses, for all students, irrespective of the community to which they belong.

26. ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE OF ABSENCE

1. Students must be present on the reopening day of the College.
2. Regular attendance at classes, Assembly, all the college functions and

- meetings is compulsory. Absence there from will be considered as an act of indiscipline.
3. Attendance on the Independence Day and Republic Day Celebrations is compulsory for all the students and staff of the College.
 4. Attendance shall be taken at every lecture, practical or tutorial of any kind, prescribed in the College time table.
 5. The attendance for Physical Training and N.C.C. parade shall be calculated separately.
 6. Each department shall maintain an accurate daily record of the attendance of each student and the staff shall report promptly to the Head of the Department the names of those students who have acquired a third successive absence (listing dates of such absence) and a list of those whose absence in the opinion of the staff are too numerous or frequent.
 7. Persistent absence for a week from classes, assemblies, laboratories or other exercises (including Physical Education) without justifiable cause, will be sufficient reason for the student's name to be removed from the rolls.
 8.
 - (a) No student shall absent herself without leave for any day or part of the day. Application for leave must be made to the Principal through the Head of the Department who will forward the same with her remarks.
 - (b) When absent due to unforeseen causes, an application for leave must be submitted as early as possible and in no case later than on the first day of return to the College.
 - (c) Leave will not be granted during working hours for the purpose of meeting parents, guardians, relatives and friends. The students shall keep their parents, guardians, relatives and friends informed that they should not be disturbed during working hours of the College and that they should conform to the rules of the College.
 - (d) Students are not to resort to insanitary, dusty or dirty practices in open spaces within the compound of the College for having their lunch. They should not resort to edibles sold on the road side.
 9. Absence without leave for the whole or part of the day renders the students liable to loss of two days attendance. An additional penalty of fine will be imposed in case of continued irregularity.
 10. A student, who is absent without leave for any hour of the day will be regarded as being absent for half a day.
 11. In case of sickness, the Principal may require a Medical Certificate from the College Medical Officer.
 12. Students who absent themselves from classes by anticipating the time of departure, or fail to return on the specified day after a vacation, shall be fined and shall in addition lose two days attendance for each day of absence.
 13. The Annual Certificate of attendance required for the Semester Examination will in no case be granted unless:
 - (i) The Principal is satisfied with the student's progress and conduct.

29. PROGRAMME OFFERED UNDER THE CHOICE - BASED CREDIT SYSTEM

Undergraduate Programmes B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com.

Structure of the Degree Programme with Choice Based Credit System

(Effective from the year 2008-2009)

In the Choice Based Credit System, each course offered in a semester is assigned a certain number of credits, depending on the quantum of work required to be put in by the student. The courses have been designed with a weightage of 2-5 credits/paper. For example, a 5-credit major core theory course involves 5 lecture hours per week. The credit thus indicates the weightage assigned to each course and only if a student passes a course, she will earn the credits assigned to that paper.

At the Undergraduate level, a student must necessarily complete a minimum of 140 Credits for a Bachelor's Degree.

The Undergraduate Programme has the following components:

- Part I - Language - Foundation Course Tamil / Hindi / Urdu / Arabic / French / Sanskrit
- Part II - Foundation English I Semester - Preliminary English, II Semester - Intermediate English, III Semester - Progressive English, IV Semester - Advanced English
- Part III - Core, Allied, Core Electives / Project and Practical
- Part IV - (a) Value Education
(b) Soft Skills
(c) Environmental Studies
(d) Basic Tamil
(e) Advanced Tamil
(f) Non-Major Elective
(g) Skill based subjects
- Part V - (a) Extension Activities
NSS/NCC / Sports

Part I Language, Part II English and Part III comprising Core, Allied and Core Elective / Project and Practical are mandatory courses.

In addition to the core courses, a student should take courses under Part IV (ag) to obtain the minimum number of 140 credits.

Part V - A student has to compulsorily participate in NSS/NCC/Sports during the first year to earn one credit.

Every Degree Course requires each student to participate in an "OUTREACH" programme and to complete a project which may require the students to go outside the campus in connection with the "OUTREACH' programme / Project Work.

In addition to the activities mentioned above, all Departments have their own Clubs and Associations.

Non-Major Elective courses are offered to students of other Departments. Students therefore can opt for Non-Major Elective courses offered by the other Departments.

Value Added Courses

All Departments of the College offer Value Added Courses related to their subject to the final year students. These courses will add value to their existing program and enrich their knowledge and enhance their skills for employability.

Additional Credits

A student can earn additional credits by pursuing the following Programmes and activities conducted within or outside college.

Additional Credits to be offered for Internship / Certificate Programmes/Add on Courses/Value added courses /Online courses.

The following programmes and activities conducted within or outside the college will account for the Extra Credits other than the minimum credits (140) required to complete the UG course.

The College offers Career Oriented programmes [COP] initiated under the UGC scheme with an objective to introduce Add on courses that hone the skills of the students to cater to job markets, employment and over all empowerment of students .

30. CONTINUOUS INTERNAL ASSESSMENT AND EXAMINATIONS

Students are assessed continuously and Model Examinations are conducted every term. Online progress reports are generated and parents are required to monitor their wards performance. Selection for the Autonomous End Semester Examination will be made on the basis of the following.

- a) Continuous Internal Assessment
- b) Attendance (Minimum 75%)
- c) Conduct and behaviour

The Decision of the Principal will be final.

END SEMESTER EXAMINATIONS (ESE) - RULES & REGULATIONS

The performance of students in all theory and practical examinations will be evaluated through Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and End Semester Examinations (ESE). The ratio of weightage given to CIA and End of Semester Examination marks is 30:70 for candidates admitted from the academic year 2021-2022. All the theory and practical examinations of the Under Graduate Courses shall be held both in Odd and Even Semesters of every year. A student is required to obtain 40% marks in End Semester Examinations and 40% marks in the aggregate to be declared having passed the examination.

If a student fails in theory paper, she will have to re-appear for that paper in the subsequent semester as an arrear paper. Every semester examination is considered as a chance to reappear until the students has completed the course. Beyond the minimum duration prescribed for the programme the student may be allowed two years to complete the programme in their original syllabus.

If a student fails in a practical examination in the Odd semester she has to repeat the practical examination in the following Even semester and not wait until the next Odd semester. The same procedure will be followed for the Students failing in the Even Semester Practical Examination also.

The following shall be the break-up of the composition of 30 marks allotted for the purpose of continuous internal assessment.

Attendance requirement for End Semester Examinations :

Every teacher handling a course is responsible for keeping a record of and calculating the attendance of all students registered for her course (i.e.) attendance is calculated course-wise.

The students are required to have a minimum of 75% of attendance to appear for the End Semester Examinations.

- (i) Students who have attendance between 65% and 74% should pay a condonation fee, to appear for the End Semester Examinations.
- (ii) Students who have secured attendance between 50% and 64% are NOT eligible for condonation of shortage of attendance and such candidates will not be permitted to appear for the End Semester Examination in that Semester but they shall have to pay the condonation fee in the same Semester and will be allowed to proceed to the next semester. They will be permitted to take the missed End

Semester Examinations in the following semester as arrears.

- (iii) Students who have secured less than 50% of attendance shall have to repeat the course (by rejoining) after completing the course. Prior permission has to be obtained from the Controller of Examinations JBAS College.
- (iv) Students with 0% attendance in a semester shall not proceed to the following semester without completing the missed semester.
- (v) In respect of married women students undergoing UG/PG courses, the minimum attendance for condonation (Theory / Practical) shall be relaxed and prescribed as 55% instead of 65% if they conceive during their academic year. Medical Certificate from the Doctor attached to a Government Hospital (D.G.O.) shall be forwarded to the C.O.E. office so that condonation of attendance mentioned under this category can be granted.

MAXIMUM PERIOD FOR COMPLETION OF THE PROGRAMS TO QUALIFY FOR A DEGREE FOR STUDENTS ADMITTED FROM 2018 ONWARDS :

As per the University circular dated 08.02.2018,

- a. A Student, who for whatever reasons is not able to complete the programme within the normal period (N) or the Minimum duration prescribed for the programme, may be allowed two years period beyond the normal period to clear the backlog to be qualified for the degree. (Time Span = $N+2$ years for the completion of programme).
- b. During the extended period the student shall be considered as a Private Candidate and also not be eligible for RANKING.

CONCESSIONS FOR DIFFERENTLY- ABLED STUDENTS :

- 1. For students who are mentally disabled, having disability and mental retardation, slow learners are eligible for the following concessions:
 - (i) Part I Foundation course Tamil or any other Language shall be exempted.
 - (ii) One - third of the allotted time may be given as extra time for the examination.
 - (iii) Leniency in overlooking spelling mistakes, and
 - (iv) Scribes for all courses provided if the request is duly certified by the Medical Board of the Government Hospital/ General Hospital / District headquarters Hospital and they shall be declared qualified for the degree if they pass the other examinations

prescribed for the degree.

Dyslexic students should apply to the University of Madras for grant of exemption and obtain the orders within 30 days from the last day of admission and before the commencement of First Semester Examinations.

FEE PAYMENT FOR ESE :

The Examination fees should be paid online twice a year. The dates for payment of exam fee are published in the college calendar.

TIME TABLE FOR ESE :

End Semester Examination time table will be displayed both in the college notice board and in the college website **coe.jbascollege.edu.in**

Students are required to download the hall ticket from the college website one week before the Examination. All instructions are given in detail in the Hall ticket.

PREVENTION OF MALPRACTICE:

The College views Examination malpractice of any kind very seriously. Any student found to be directly or indirectly involved in malpractice of any kind during examinations will be subject to substantial penalties, including being debarred from subsequent appearances. If malpractice is detected during the Semester Examination, the following steps shall be taken:

1. The student will be questioned by a committee comprising of the Principal, the Additional Chief Superintendents, Controller of Examinations and the Invigilator who detected the malpractice. The evidence in respect of commission of the malpractice will be analyzed and, if proved, then the parents of the student will be informed. They will be required to come to the College and escort the student home. The consequences of the malpractice will be explained to the parents by the committee members.
2. If the student is found guilty, "Zero" marks will be given for the concerned paper in which the student was found to have committed malpractice during that Semester.
3. Her hall ticket will be seized and she will be debarred from taking all the subsequent examinations during that Semester and marked "Absent".

REVALUATION:

The number of days to apply for revaluation shall be 5 working days commencing from the day after the publication of results.

The last date for applying for a photocopy of the answer scripts is 3 working days from the date of publication of results. The students should collect the same from the C.O.E.'s office the next day. The last date for submitting the application for revaluation is the 7th working day from the date of publication of results.

Revaluation Fee challan and application form may be collected from the Controller of Examinations office.

CONTINUOUS INTERNAL ASSESSMENT (C.I.A.) Improvement

C.I.A. Improvement Tests are administered to those students who have passed their End Semester Examinations but have failed to pass the subject for want of a minimum aggregate of 40 marks. C.I.A. Improvement Tests shall be conducted by the concerned Department in the immediately following Semester, so as to enable the students to clear the subject, without their having to write the external examination in the subject.

C.I.A. Improvement Tests may be given in respect of I to V Semesters as long as the students are on the Rolls of the College. The C.I.A. Improvement fee shall be collected as "Arrear Examination Fee"

After the VI semester, such a student who is no longer on the Rolls, shall fill up the C.I.A. Improvement Application form, and obtain the signature of the particular subject teacher and the concerned H.O.D. and pay the C.I.A. Improvement fee after obtaining the challan from the C.O.E.'s office. This process is to be completed within fifteen (15) days of the College reopening.

PENALTY:

A fine of Rs. 50/- (Rupees fifty only) per month to a maximum of Rs. 1000/- (Rupees one thousand only) per Marksheet will be charged for any delay in notifying the errors or discrepancies in the Marksheet or certificate issued to the students beyond ten (10) working days of their receipt of such documents.

ARREAR EXAMINATIONS:

Students who have arrears in examination papers, due to any reason shall be required to appear for these arrears in the succeeding semester on payment of examination fee for each such arrear paper until they actually pass and clear the examination in the prescribed period of study.

In case of students who have completed the course of study and are not on its rolls, they may register for appearance in the arrear paper of any semester following the semester of failure within four (4) consecutive semesters under the same syllabus. All arrear examination should be cleared within 2 years after completion of the course. Beyond the 2 years, the students has to join the course afresh from the I semester.

INSTANT EXAMINATIONS:

As per the University norms Instant Examinations will be conducted for the final year UG & PG students who have only one arrear in the regular theory papers of the final semester examination.

A student having arrear in any other semester is not eligible and if a candidate is absent in the current appearance is also not eligible for appearing in the Instant Examinations. Students who have arrear in Practical/Project and those who indulged in malpractice are not eligible to take up the Instant Examinations.

With the focussed efforts of the IQAC, Our College was accredited with '5 Star' status in the year 1999, with 'A+' grade in 2007 and with an outstanding CGPA of 3.61 (out of 4) at 'A' Grade in 2013. The College was accredited with A⁺⁺ Grade with CGPA of 3.58 on a 4 point scale in the 4th cycle in 2022. The IQAC channelized the efforts and measures of our Institution towards Academic Excellence.

35. LABORATORIES

Great care must be taken in handling apparatus. All breakages, damage, loss etc., must be reported to the Staff concerned as soon as they occur. The cost of the breakage, damage and loss will be recovered from the students concerned individually or collectively. These should be brought to the notice of the Principal forthwith. It is the duty of the Staff to conform to this rule strictly. The work tables and sanitary fittings should be kept clean and tidy at all times. In case of breakage of equipments, apparatus, other articles or any property of the college, charges will be collected either individually or collectively from the students as the case may be. The decision of the Principal will be Final in this matter.

36. PRAYER HALL

All Muslim students and Muslim Staff members are expected to pray in the exquisite Prayer Hall situated within the campus. The Architecture of the Mosque is unique in the whole country. All Muslim Students and Staff are required to provide themselves with a head cover for use while at prayer. The Prayer Hall is a sacred place for worship. Students are not permitted to use the Prayer Hall for any purpose other than to offer prayers.

37. ISLAMIC LIBRARY

Under the auspices of the Southern India Education Trust, the Academy of Islamic Research maintains an Islamic Library with a wide collection of nearly 8500 books on all aspects of Islamic History and Culture in Urdu, Arabic, English and Tamil. The Staff and Students of the Forenoon and Afternoon Session are eligible to become members of the Islamic Library by paying a one - time fee of Rs.50/- for their tenure in the college.

38. STUDENTS' COUNSELLING CENTRE

The College has a Counselling Centre "Blossom" associated with the Psychology Department. The Centre deals with the students' personal, Interpersonal, Academic and Vocational issues. It also provides growth-oriented training for improving overall mental health and vigour. Students finding themselves in the grip of personal adjustment can seek the help of a well qualified and experienced Counsellor. The Counsellor employs different psychological tools and techniques for identifying and correcting the problem. Various programmes on personality development, problem-solving, conflict resolution, and stress management are conducted at 'Blossom'. The Centre ensures to keep all matters extremely confidential. The service is free and the students can avail themselves of these services during and after the College hours.

39. HEALTH SERVICE

Our Health Clinic provides urgent medical attention to Faculty, Staff and Students. When they are sick, necessary recommendations are prescribed. Yearly health check up is conducted to all the first year students of the Institution. A Physical Examination form for each student filled in by the Physician is filed in the College Office after it has been duly signed by the Doctor.

40. PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Every student of the First year degree class, unless medically exempted, will be required to undergo the course of physical training prescribed by the College. The students who do not attend 75% of the classes will not be eligible to appear for the Semester Examination.

The Programme of Physical Education in the College includes individual and group games like Ball Badminton, Throw Ball, Badminton, Volley Ball, Basket Ball, Table Tennis, Carrom, Aerobic Programme, Chess, Kabaddi, Khokho, Handball, Cricket and Karate.

Sports quota for Admissions into various courses is available for the District / State / National/International Level Players. They are also eligible for the fee waivers facility. Experienced physical trainers train the students. An exclusive gym facility is available inside the College campus for the fitness of the staff and students.

41. CENTRE FOR WOMEN'S STUDIES

The Centre for Women's Studies of Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women is the first UGC Sponsored Centre under the University of Madras and was established in the year 2005. The four cutting edge objectives of the centre are Teaching, Training, Research and Advocacy.

The centre has good Infrastructural facilities and a library with a high quality collection of books on various aspects of Women. The Centre offers two Non-Major Elective papers for the UG Students of the Forenoon session under the OBE System. The centre regularly organizes special lectures, seminars, workshops, conferences, training and gender sensitization programs. The Centre advocates in creating awareness on social legislations, constitutional guarantees, government policies and programmes available for the development and empowerment of women.

42. CAREER GUIDANCE & PLACEMENT CENTRE

The Centre renders to help students to seek career information. It guides the students to develop a career plan which includes assessing skills and interest, giving inputs about the occupation they seek to pursue. If additional training is required during this process, the students is given information about the different types of training programmes that will best meet her career objectives. The centre provides training for first year, second year and final year students on pre-requisite skills. Various National and Multi-National companies approach the centre for part-time and full-time job opportunities for students who are still pursuing their education and for students who have completed their education. The Career Guidance and Placement Centre thus inculcates in students the awareness of the options available at various stages in their education so as to enable them to choose and be responsible for their future careers.

43. JBAS BUSINESS INCUBATION CENTRE

“Convert Your Innovative Ideas to Reality”

The “Business Incubation Centre” is a recent venture of Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women. It was commenced in the year August 2019 and aims to nurture and encourage students with innovative business ideas. The goal of this centre is to encourage entrepreneurship among the UG and PG students, research scholars and also to be connected with the alumnae by providing them a platform for developing and encouraging their interest in business assignments.

The aim of this centre is to identify students with innovative skills and creativity and help them at every stage of their initiation process, making their business a successful enterprise. The club lends support to the young and vibrant budding entrepreneurs with creative quest and zeal to become successful entrepreneurs. The students are urged to make use of this laudable initiative by the Management of JBAS College as they are given exposure to intellectual expertise by the Directors and experienced panel members of BIC.

44. MULTI-DISCIPLINARY RESEARCH AND CONSULTANCY CENTRE (MRCC)

The MRCC has been established with the objective of inculcating and developing research spirit among staff and students and to enhance consultancy avenues in the Departments. The Central Instrumentation Centre (CIC) of the MRCC houses sophisticated equipment common to Science Departments. The CIC caters to staff and students for carrying out tests/experiments from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. The centre is also open to corporate houses and research scholars for research work at nominal fees. The E-Learning Centre of the MRCC has computer systems with internet connection for accessing online research content for research scholars, staff and students. The centre also provides access to Statistical analysis software. An Intellectual Property Rights Cell also functions within the fold of MRCC. This cell conducts IPR awareness programs and assists faculty with IPR related procedures.

Student Research Grants are given to meritorious Undergraduate and Postgraduate students. The prestigious grant apart from imparting a vibrant research experience comes with a grant letter, additional credits and certificate of completion for socially relevant and innovative projects. The Seed Capital Assistance Scheme and the Financial Assistance for Research Work are aimed at encouraging faculty to scale greater heights in the field of research.

45. STUDENTS ASSOCIATION ACTIVITIES

a. The College Students' Council

All students shall be members of the College Council, the object and aim of which is to promote student activities and to develop a sense of loyalty, self-expression, responsibility and self-discipline in the students.

The Management sets apart a certain amount, out of its funds, towards expenses for the activities of the Students' Council. The Principal will draw the required amount from time to time.

The Principal shall be 'Ex-Officio' President of the Students' Council. The Students' Council Chairman shall preside over the ordinary meetings of the Students' Council. The Governing Bcdy shall be kept informed of all the activities of the college and the Students Council from time to time, much in advance of each activity.

No extraordinary meeting of any College Association or the Student Council shall be held and no non-member of the College shall be invited to address any meeting in the College premises without the permission of the Principal. Violation of this rule will be considered a breach of discipline.

The College Management celebrates, for the benefit of the students and for the development of their intellectual and physical capacities the following functions during the academic year in consultation and under the guidance of the Correspondent. Every student shall co-operate in making these functions a success.

On days when the College Management celebrates the functions mentioned above, refreshments will be available only to those students who participate in the function.

Separate fees may be levied for conducting the above activities if so decided upon by the Governing Body.

Students are encouraged to participate in debates, music, dance and dramatic competition held in the college and they are also permitted to participate in the other educational institutions. A Mega Intercollegiate Event 'CHARISHMA' is conducted every year to encourage the artistic talents of the students. Many famous personalities are invited to inaugurate and judge the events. 'Miss Charisma' award is presented to the best performer.

c. Extra - Curricular Activities

At the beginning of the Academic year, various groups and student organisations are formed. Each student is required to join atleast one group or organisation which suits her subjects of study and aptitude. New clubs or groups may be organised with the permission of the Principal as and when sufficient interest is shown. Each group will be under a competent advisor from the Teaching Staff. 46. CLUBS AND COMMITTEES

a. The Honours Club

The Honours Club of JBAS, established in 2010, is the brain child of our respected Chairman, Janab Mooza Raza Saheb. The club was initiated with the objective of nurturing and promoting reading habit among staff and students. Two book review meetings are conducted every semester by the Honours Club of the Forenoon and Afternoon Sessions. A wide range of books belonging to various genres are reviewed during these meetings. Since 2019, the club activities expanded its horizon to instil the skills of creative and critical thinking among students. Honours club provides a unique platform for the

students to develop their oratorical skills. Honours Club aims to promote creativity, originality and artistic writing. Eminent scholars, professors, writers, editors, orators and illustrious personalities from various walks of life are invited to interact with the students and judge the competitions. The winners of various competitions are honoured with certificates and cash awards.

b. Enviro Club

The motto of Enviroclub is “Nurture Nature, Save Future”. The Enviroclub was the brainchild of our former Principal, Late Dr. Nausheen Dawood and it was started in the year 2005. The main objective of the Enviroclub is to protect and conserve our Environment for a sustainable future. Interdepartmental and Intercollegiate competitions are regularly organized and eminent environmentalists are invited for seminars, workshops etc., to create awareness on current environmental issues.

Every year 5 students from each class are enrolled as Enviroclub members, and they are involved in various activities like enhancing the greenery and maintaining the cleanliness of the campus. The students participate in different extension activities in association with various Environmental organizations, NGOs etc. The Enviroclub conducts Green Audit, Environment Audit and Energy Audit in the campus. The Enviroclub members receive a certificate at the end of their final year for their valuable contributions.

c. Herbal Club

The Herbal Club is an extension activity of the Department of Botany. It was started in the year 2010 and aims to create awareness on the medicinal values of the herbal plants. The Herbal Club maintains a beautiful herbal garden. A book about the flora of the college campus has been published. The Herbal Club conducts seminars, workshops and organises medicinal plants exhibition every year for the benefit of the students.

d. Balise Club

Building Aptitude and Logical Thinking in a Systematic Way with Ease is a student-organized initiative supported by the placement officer and representatives from the Career Guidance and Placement Centre. The club's mission is to enhance students' preparedness for job interviews and other future challenges. Its focus is on developing students' skills and

capabilities, fostering a positive and confident approach to life. BALISE CLUB offers a variety of programs, including public speaking, competitive exam preparation, monthly quizzes, mock interviews, skill assessments, and career-related activities.

e. Live Wire

Livewire is an online magazine published once a month under the able guidance of the Teacher Coordinators and a committed team of Student editors. It was inaugurated in July 2009 and is also known as online newsletter. It forms a part of the unit of The Papyrus Club, which hosted a website of online newsletter of 296 colleges and 1407 schools across India. The online newsletter was renamed as JBAS online magazine in the Academic year 2015-16. Livewire not only publishes campus news to keep the JBAS community informed of the events of the Institution, but also gives opportunities to students to hone their creative writing skills. The aim of Livewire is to educate, empower and facilitate Journalistic skills among students. Livewire encourages all the members to record the events that take place in the college. It's objectives include nourishing social responsibilities in students by sharing their views through the 'Writers Column'.

f. The National Service Scheme

Education through service is the dimension, the NSS imparts to the student community. The main aim of NSS is to develop the personality of students by involving them in community service. The College provides for 300 student volunteers to enrol themselves under NSS, sponsored by the University of Madras. The volunteers who have served for 2 years and have performed for 240 hours of work are entitled to a certificate from the University of Madras. Regular activities for 120 and Annual Special Camp for 120 hours are the regular features of the NSS. The college arranges for the seven day special camp meant for task oriented community service.

g. National Cadet Corps

The NCC was introduced in the year 1956 and is designed to develop qualities of leadership discipline, character, health and citizenship. It offers the students an opportunity to participate in activities which include Drill, parades and camps. It provides service training to youth so as to stimulate their interest in the defense of the country, self discipline and physical health.

The college has an Army wing with a total strength of 104 Cadets and one Officer. The cadets attend the Combined Annual Training camp,

Annual Training camp Inter group competitions, Republic day parade camp, Thal sainik camp, Basic leadership training camp, National Integration camp and participate in all ceremonial parades. Students benefit from this activity and are expected to join the National Cadet Corps in large numbers.

Note: The N.C.C. Cadets are required to attend a minimum of 75% of parades and if they fail to attend this minimum, they will be disqualified from appearing for B & C certificate examination.

h. Youth Red Cross

“The Youth Red Cross” is the most significant constituent of its mother organisation, Indian Red Cross Society. It is a group movement organised for the students between 18 and 25 years of age within the Colleges, affiliated to the respective universities.

The aims of YRC are:

- a) Promotion of health and hygiene.
- b) Service to the sick and suffering.
- c) Promotion of national and international friendship.

The interested students of the UG and PG courses are the members of the Youth Red Cross. The students will be made to participate in seminars, training programmes, study camps at the University, State or at the National level.

i. Religious Instruction

The RI FORUM aims to nurture the spiritual wellbeing of the Muslim Students. It supplements and complements the Academic studies and provides facilities and opportunities for better understanding of religion and enhances the quality of Interpersonal relationships with high moral standards. The course is directed to build a strong foundation of high moral values for a better understanding of other religions, secular values and peaceful coexistence in the multi-cultural, multi religious and multilingual country of ours. The students are trained them to transmit this understanding for the betterment of the society and nation. Quality of the highest order in every sphere is the aim of the Institution and every effort is made towards that end.

Religious instruction classes are conducted for Muslim students on every Thursday from 10.35 to 11.15 a.m. by a team of dedicated muslim

staff members of the respective Departments and the course culminates with the Annual Examination. Every Friday renowned speakers are invited to address the students on topics related to Islam and social harmony at the College masjid during the RI hour.

Every year an Essay writing competition on “Life and Teachings of Prophet (PBUH)” is conducted in English for Muslim and non- Muslim Students to promote a better understanding of religion. The course and the lectures are compulsory for all Muslim students and staff members.

j. Anti - Ragging Committee

The College has established an Anti-Ragging Committee that operates in accordance with UGC Guidelines. The Committee is headed by the Principal and Vice Principal and ably guided by the senior faculty members and representatives of Students Council. The Committee conducts periodic meetings and close monitoring and ensures that no incidents of ragging takes place in the Institution.

k. Student Welfare Committee

College life is an exciting transition stage from school to adulthood and it serves as a critical stage of one's life. Students Welfare Committee has been started in the year 2018. The committee deals with the welfare of the students, the future leaders by organizing events aimed at improving students social and life skills, campaigning, organising health awareness programmes and representing a variety of issues that students face, enabling them to be responsible and successful in life.

I. Student Grievance Redressal Committee (SGRC)

It is good to air a grievance rather than to keep it bottled up. The Grievance Redressal Cell strives to ensure transparency in all college activities and provides students an opportunity to address their grievances. The committee deals with the grievances directly related to the common problems of the students. Objective of the Grievance Redressal cell are

In accordance to this Act, the College has instituted an Internal Complaints Committee which ensures a safe and secure environment. The committee will address to any complaint received in this regard within a reasonable time frame.

n. Young Entrepreneurs Development Council (YEDC)

The Young Entrepreneurs Forum (YEF) was formed in the year 2012 to kindle innovative ideas among students and promote startups. In the year 2021, the college has enrolled with Entrepreneurship Development and Innovation Institute which is run by Department of MSME-Government of Tamil Nadu. The Young Entrepreneur Forum is now merged with the Afternoon Session Entrepreneur Development Cell and has formed 'Young Entrepreneur Development Council'- YEDC with effect from October 2021. The objective of the forum is to equip students with requisite entrepreneurial skills, knowledge and competitiveness, to conduct workshop on entrepreneur awareness and impart skills and behavioural training for problem solving and communication. All undergraduate students from various disciplines both Forenoon & Afternoon session are the members of the YEDC. All activities are planned and decided much ahead by the team of faculty members depending on the need and availability of Resource Person. The YEDC activities include workshops, seminars and hands-on-training.

o. Consumer Rights Association (CRA)

Consumer Club of our college recognized as the CONSUMER RIGHTS ASSOCIATION (CRA) was initiated in the year 2009 with a great zeal and dedication in order to create responsiveness among Staff and Students about the consumer rights and responsibilities. The Consumer Rights Association collaborates with various consumer activist groups like Consumer Association of India, Citizen and Civic Action Group and other Voluntary Consumer Organizations and NGOs to create consciousness on consume rights and also to encourage each and every person to become

a sma consumer in order to handle day to day consumer issues. In addition to this, the club conducts seminars and workshops on various topics relating t adulteration issues, awareness on food safety and much more. The objective of the CRA are to educate students about their rights as a citizen of Indi under Consumer Protection Act, 2019 and to impart knowledge about real life situations and to enable the students to develop courage to handl consumer grievances.

2. The Endowment consists of a sum of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand only) donated by Sri. R. Krishnaswamy Reddiar Trust.
3. The said sum of Rs. 10,000/- shall be invested in appropriate securities yielding an income of at least 5% per annum according to the discretion of the Executive Council of the Trust.
4. Out of the Annual Income derived from the Endowment one or more Scholarships shall be awarded to deserving students studying in the Degree Course in Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women, on the basis of merit cum means on the recommendation of the Principal of the College.

A-2 Mrs. Zulaikha Begum Endowment

1. This Endowment is founded by Mr. M. Abdul Subhan Saheb, M.A., merchant and landlord of No. 37, Perianna Maistry Street, Periamet, Chennai in the name of his wife for the purpose promoting Medical Education in the Muslim Community. The following shall be the terms and conditions of the Endowment.
2. The Endowment shall be known as The Zulaika Begum Scholarship Endowment.
3. The Endowment Consists of a sum of Rs. 2500/- (Rupees two thousand and five hundred Only) donated by M. Abdul Subhan Sahib, M.A., No. 37, Perianna Maistry St., Periamet, Chennai, and any other sum that may be received in future to further augment this Endowment.

4. The corpus of the Endowment shall be vested in trust in the Executive Council of the Southern India Education Trust and the Endowment shall be administered by the Executive Council of the Southern Indian Education Trust.
5. The said sum of Rs. 2,500/- together with future accrual, shall remain invested in suitable securities, movable or immovable, yielding an income at a reasonable rate.
6. The net income derived from the endowment shall be available for the award of one or more Scholarships for a period of ten months in the year to any Muslim woman student studying in Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women taking the subject prescribed for enabling her to take up the Medical Degree course in the University of Madras. This Scholarship shall be awarded in consideration of merit and means.
7. The Scholarship shall be tenable for the period of one or more years prescribed for qualifying to enter in the Medical Course by the Rules and Regulations of the University.
8. The Executive Council shall have the power for good and valid reasons to vary the terms of the Endowment to suit any altered situation at any future time.
9. This Prize shall be given on the College Day.

A-3 Hasan Chida Endowment

1. This Endowment for the Hasan Chida Prize is founded by the Late Chairman, Mrs. Fathima Akhtar, B.A., wife of Mr. Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed of "Sadhr Gardens", Alwarpet, Chennai - 600 018, in memory of the late Mr. Md. Hasan Chida Saheb B.A., Commissioner of Income Tax.
2. This endowment shall be called 'Hasan Chida Prize Endowment" and the prize shall be called 'Hasan Chida Prize" founded by Mrs. Fathima Akhtar.
3. The Endowment consists of a sum of Rs. 1,000/- (Rupees one thousand only) donated by Mrs. Fathima Akhtar, resided at "Sadhr Gardens", Aiwarpet, Chennai - 18.

4. The corpus of the Endowment shall be vested in Trust in the Executive Council of the Southern India Education Trust and the Endowment shall be administered by the Executive Council of the Trust.
5. The said sum of Rs. 1,000/- together with future accrual if any, shall remain invested in securities yielding an income at a reasonable rate of interest.
6. The net income derived from the Endowment shall be available for the award of a prize in cash, medal or in books to Non - Muslim women students studying in Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women for the best essays written in English or any other language on The Life and Teachings of Prophet Mohammed (SAW) at a competition held each year for the purpose on a date and time fixed by the Executive Council of the Trust.

9. If for any reason, the prize is not awarded in any year, the income shall be added on to the corpus of the Endowment.
10. The Executive Council of the Trust shall have the power for good and valid reasons to alter or vary the terms of this Endowment to suit any altered situation at any future time.

A-4 Begum Ubaidulla Endowment

1. This Endowment for the Begum Ubaidulla Prize is founded by Mr. A. Haji Mohamed Ubaidulla G.D.A., F.C.A., No.32, Marakayar Labbai Street, Chennai in the name of his wife for the purpose of promoting the study of 'The Life and Teachings of the Holy Prophet Mohammed' (May peace and the blessings of Allah be upon him).
2. This Endowment shall be known as "Begum Ubaidulla Prize Endowment", and the prize shall be called as "Begum Ubaidullah Prize".
3. This Endowment shall consist, at present of a sum of Rs. 350/- (Rupees three hundred and fifty only) for which face value the funder has transferred in favour of the Southern India Education Trust, Madras, his share in the Egmore Benefit Society Limited, Third Branch, Chennai - 7, though the market value of the same is estimated to be about Rs. 1,000/- (Rupees one thousand only).

4. The corpus of the Endowment shall vest in trust with the Executive Council of the Southern India Education Trust and the Endowment shall be administered by them.

6. All further accretion to the corpus of the Endowment shall remain invested, in suitable securities, movable or immovable yielding an income at a reasonable rate.
7. The net income derived from the Endowment shall, to the extent of Rs. 50/- (Rupees fifty only) be available for the award of one or more prizes to Non - Muslim women students studying in Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women, Chennai, for the best essay written in the Tamil Language on 'The Life and Teachings of the Holy Prophet Mohammed' (SAW) at a competition arranged and held each year for the purpose on a date and at a time fixed by the Executive Council of the Trust.
8. The Founder shall reimburse the Trust every year, if there is any fall below the income of Rs. 50/- from the Endowment.
9. Any income exceeding Rs. 50/- per year may be diverted to the award of another prize.
10. The prize shall be awarded to the students whose essays are adjudged to be the best by a body of judges appointed by the Executive Council of the Trust.
11. The prize shall be given on the occasion of the College Day Celebrations.
12. If for any reason, the prize is not awarded in any year the income together with the surplus balance, if any left over annually when it amounts to Rs. 50/- shall be transferred and added on to the corpus of the Endowment.
13. The Executive Council of the Trust shall have the power for good and valid reasons to alter or vary the terms of this Endowment to suit any altered situation at any future time.

A-5 Begum Shafia Nazir Hussain Endowment

1. This Endowment is founded by Mrs. Fathima Akhtar (Mrs. Basheer Ahmed Sayeed, Late Chairman of the Trust).
2. The Endowment consists of a sum of Rs. 500/- (Rupees five hundred only) donated by Mrs. Fathima Akhtar.
3. The corpus of the Endowment will be invested in fixed deposit or any other security yielding a reasonable income at the discretion of the Executive Council of the Trust.
4. The income realized from the Endowment will be awarded as prize to any student of Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women who passes out of the College in B.Sc. Home Science securing the highest grades in Part III B of the Examination in her first attempt.
5. The Prize will be ordinarily awarded on the occasion of the Convocation along with other prizes.
6. The Executive Council of the Trust shall have the power for good and valid reasons to vary the terms of the Endowment to suit any altered situation at any future time.

A-6 Hajani Fathima Akhtar Endowment

1. The Endowment is known as “Fathima Akhtar Prize Scholarship Endowment”.
2. The corpus of this Endowment shall consist of a sum of Rs. 2,000/- (Rupees two thousand only) donated by Mr. Dastagir of M/s. Bandula Stores, Rangoon, Burma and any further sum that may be added on to the corpus from time to time.
3. The corpus of this Endowment shall be invested in income yielding securities at the highest rate of interest available with the banks or recognized Societies.
4. This income derived from the Endowment shall be utilized for the purpose of awarding a prize to any student of Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women, who stands first among the students of the College in the B.Sc. Home Science final Degree Examination and passes the Examination in the first attempt, obtaining the highest marks in the subject of Child Development and Family Relations.

5. The Executive Council shall have the discretion to decide in any year that the award shall be a scholarship awarded to a student who has passed the B.Sc. Home Science degree with distinction for pursuing study in the M.Sc. Home Science degree if the income derived so permits. The award may also be for pursuing studies in Home Science.
6. The Executive Council shall also have the right not to award the prize or scholarship in any year without proper reasons in which case the income derived shall be added on to the corpus of the Endowment.
7. This prize shall be given on the Convocation Day.

A-7 Hakeem Md. Khader Hussain Sayeed Endowment

1. This Endowment is founded by Mr. Basheer Ahmed Sayeed, Founder of the Trust, in memory of his Late father Janab Hakeem Mohammed Khader Hussain Sayeed Saheb (who died on 30th September 1945).
2. The corpus of this Endowment consists of a sum of Rs. 3,000/- (Rupees Three Thousand only) invested in fixed deposit bearing interest at 11% per annum with the Bank of Baroda (or any Co-operative bank).
3. The income derived from this Endowment will be utilized for the award of Scholarship or Prize to students of the Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women.
4. The Executive Council of the Trust shall determine from year to year the method and manner of the award of the Scholarship and / or Prize as the case may be.
5. If so decided upon by the Executive Council, a Competitive Examination may also be held for the award of the prize to the best students in the subjects or subject to be determined by the Executive Council of the Trust.
6. If in any year the Scholarship or Prize is not awarded the income shall be added on to the corpus of the Endowment.
7. The Scholarship or Prize shall be awarded on the occasion of the College Day Celebrations and the name or names of the awarded or awardee shall be published in the Annual Report of the Trust and the report of the College.

A-8 Haji Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed Endowment

1. This Endowment consists of Rs. 5,000/- (Rupees Five Thousand only) placed at the disposal of the Trust by the Founder Janab Alhaj Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed Saheb.
2. This sum of Rs. 5,000/- will be invested in interest yielding securities at the discretion of the Executive Council.
3. The income derived from this corpus will be awarded as one or more Scholarships or Prizes at the discretion of the Executive Council to any student who joined the First year Degree Course in any Science or Arts subject on the basis of merit cum means.
4. If in any year the amount is not awarded it will be added on to the corpus and made to yield income.
5. The Executive Council has full discretion to vary the terms hereof for good and sufficient reasons in the best interest of the proper and useful disposal of the income derived.
6. The Prize shall be given on the College Day.

A-9 Dr. (Mrs.) Amathul Azeez Sayeed Endowment

1. This Endowment is instituted by Mrs. Fathima Akhtar, Chairman of S.I.E.Trust, in the name of her daughter, Dr. Amathul Azeez, who was a brilliant and outstanding alumna of Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women.
2. The corpus of the Endowment consists of a sum of Rs. 1,000/- (Rupees one thousand only) donated by the said Chairman of the Trust, Mrs. Fathima Akhtar.
3. The amount of corpus shall be invested in the highest interest yielding security with any Bank, Co-operative Society or any Benefit Fund.
4. The interest derived from the corpus shall be awarded as a prize on the College Day to the best woman student of the Degree Course whose second language is Urdu.
5. If in any one year, the prize is not awarded to the student the interest shall be added on to the corpus of the Endowment Fund.
6. The Executive Council has the power to alter the terms of the award under this Endowment to better effectuate the object and aim for which this prize is instituted.

A-10 Hasan Danial Endowment

1. This Endowment is founded by Dr. (Mrs.) Azeez Hasan Danial, M.B.B.S., an alumna of this College and President of the Alumnae Association of Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women.
2. The corpus of the Endowment consists of a sum of Rs. 500/- (Rupees five hundred only) donated by Dr. (Mrs.) Azeez Hasan Danial, now in Canada.
3. The interest derived from this Endowment is earmarked for the award of a prize usually to the best swimmer of the College and the prize will be awarded at the Swimming Meet every year.
4. The corpus will be invested in fixed deposit yielding 7½% per annum in the Banks of the College.

A-11 The most Rev. Fr. Dr. Louis Mathias Scholarship Prize Endowment

1. This Endowment consists of Rs. 6,500/- (Rupees six thousand and five hundred only) and is constituted by the Trust at the instance of the Chairman in the name of the Most Rev. Louis Mathias, Archbishop of Chennai.
2. The corpus of the Endowment, remains invested in interest yielding fixed deposit with the Bankers of the Trust (The Annual Income amount is Rs. 225/-).
3. Out of the income of this Endowment is awarded a Scholarship or Prize to the best Muslim Student of the College who stands first in the Degree Examination in Part III Humanities and desires to pursue her studies further in B.A. Degree Economics course in Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women. This should be awarded on the College Day.
4. If in any year the amount derived from the Endowment is not utilized for any reason the said amount shall be added on to the corpus of the Endowment.
5. The Executive Council of the Trust has the discretion to alter or modify the terms of the award under this Endowment in circumstances which may justify alteration or modification.

A-12 Begum S.M. Basheer Endowment

1. This Endowment is created out of the sum of Rs. 2,500/- (Rupees two thousand and five hundred only) generously donated by Mr. S.M. Basheer, B.Com. (London), F.R. Econ. Soc., Barrister - at - Law, Bashir Lodge, Kanpur, U.P in the name of his beloved wife who is no more.
2. The corpus of the Endowment, viz. Rs. 2,500/- remains invested in fixed deposit with the Bankers of the Trust yielding a sum of Rs. 187 per annum by way of interest at 7½% per annum.
3. The income thus derived is awarded as a Scholarship or as a prize on the College Day to the best student of the College who stands first in the Degree Examination in Part II Urdu Language and passes the Examination in her first attempt and who continues her Education in the Degree Course in the Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women.
4. The Executive Council of the Trust has the discretion to alter or to modify the terms of prize. If not awarded for any reason, the income derived for the year shall be added on to the corpus of the Endowment.

A-13 Miss Amathul Azeez Endowment

1. This Prize Endowment is instituted by Hajani Fathima Akhtar, Chairman and Correspondent of the Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women in the name of her daughter, Miss Amathul Azeez, an outstanding alumna of Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women.
2. The corpus of this Endowment consists of a sum of Rs. 550/- paid by Hajani Fathima Akhtar. This amount was further augmented by Rs. 450/- to make a total of Rs. 1,000/- (Rupees one thousand only).
3. The corpus will be invested in interest-yielding securities and the income so derived will be utilized for the award of a prize to the best outgoing student of B.Sc. Mathematics Degree Course in the College in the name of Miss Amathul Azeez.
4. The object of this Endowment is to encourage the study of Mathematics by students of the College in the Degree Course.
5. If in any one year the prize is not awarded to any student, the interest derived shall be added on to the corpus of the Endowment.

6. The Executive Council of the Trust shall have full power to alter the terms of the award under this Endowment at its discretion so as to serve the best interest of the College in the promotion of the study of Science.
7. The Prize is awarded on the College Day.

A-14 Swamy Bhagavathar Endowment

1. This Endowment has been created by Mrs. Dhanamani, Lecturer in Psychology and Logic in Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women in the name of her father, M.A.S.S. Swamy Bhagavathar to perpetuate his memory and in fulfilment of his desire to assist the students of the College.
2. The Endowment consists of Rs. 11,000/- (Rupees Eleven thousand only) for the time being. It may be augmented at any time by additional amounts that may be found for the purpose.
3. The corpus of the Endowment will be invested in Fixed Deposit with any Bank or Society so as to yield higher rate of interest.
4. This income derived from the Endowment shall be awarded by way of a Scholarship to one or more students of the Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women studying in the first year B.Sc. and M.Sc. Home Science on the basis of merit cum means on the College Day.
5. The Scholarship shall be tenable for a period of 3 years or 2 years as the case may be, but subject to satisfactory progress maintained by the students in their studies.
6. The Executive Council shall have the power and competence to alter the terms of the Endowment so as to better effectuate the object of the Endowment at its discretion.

A-15 Mrs. Amathul Haleem Hashim Endowment

1. This prize Endowment is instituted by Mrs. S.M.A.K. Fakhri Saheba, the mother of the late Mrs. Amathul Haleem, M.A., B.T., Professor of History in the Ethiraj College, Madras for about 25 years, and sister of Mrs. Fathima Akhtar, Chairman.
2. The corpus of the Endowment consists of a sum of Rs, 5000/- (Rupees five thousand only) in cash invested in Fixed Deposit with the Bank of Baroda bearing interest at 7% per annum and other sum that may be

invested at any time later to augment the corpus. If the prize is not awarded in any year, the income derived shall be invested in fixed deposit to augment the corpus of the Endowment.

3. The income derived from the Endowment shall be utilized for the award of two prizes to students, who will memorise the poetry of Moulana Altaf Hussain Hali and Dr. Iqbal in a competition to be held within the College at any part of the year convenient to the judges and the College. As the late Professor Mrs. Amathul Haleem liked the works of the two poets very much and was always repeating their verses and lived up to them, these poets are chosen.
4. The awardees shall be the students of the Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women and other Women's Colleges who should not have been detained in any class during the course of study in the respective colleges.
5. The awardees shall be students of the B.A. or B.Sc. Course of study in Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women or in other Women's Colleges in the city.
6. The prize to be awarded may be in the form of cash or useful books or other articles of use of permanent value.
7. The prizes shall be awarded to the students on the occasion of the College Day Celebrations of Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women.
8. The Executive Council of the Southern India Education Trust shall be competent to alter or modify the terms thereof at their discretion, if and when circumstances justify the same.

A-16 Endowment for the Founder's Day Celebrations

1. The corpus of the Endowment shall consist of a sum of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) originally made available by the Founder to the Trust.
2. This Endowment is to be utilised for the celebration of the Founder's Day to be held on 7th September of every year in a fitting manner.
3. The programme for the Founder's Day Celebration shall ordinarily consist of the following items and income of the Endowment shall be available for incurring expenditure on those and other incidental items.

- (a) A prominent person in public life, official or non- official, shall be invited to preside over the celebration and to address the gathering on the life and the achievements of the Founder.
 - (b) A tea party and / or dinner shall be arranged on the occasion for the invitees.
 - (c) A variety entertainment shall be arranged on the occasion.
 - (d) Competition among the students in Quranic recitation, Sport and Debates shall be held and prizes awarded to the students adjudged the best.
4. Until such time as the terms hereof are put into effect and as long as the celebrations remain consequently postponed, the interest accrued on the investment shall be added to the corpus of the Endowment from year to year.
 5. In consultation with the Founder and / or his heirs, it shall be lawful for the authorities of the Trust and College to add to the items of the programme celebrating the Founder's Day.

A-17 Home Science Department Endowment

1. The corpus of this Endowment shall consist of a sum of Rs. 1,500/- (Rupees one thousand and five hundred only) (Rs. 1,200/- received from the Home Science department by way of sale proceeds of the Department plus Rs. 300/- from the College funds).
2. This sum shall be invested in fixed deposit yielding 13% interest per annum to constitute an Endowment for the award of Scholarship on the College Day to a third year student of B.Sc. Home Science of this College. Academic performance in the class and in the Autonomous End Semester Examination, plus economic condition will be the criteria for the award of the Scholarship. The term of the Scholarship will be for one year.

A-18 Khan Bahadur Moulvi Mohammed Sahib Endowment

1. The Prize Endowment is instituted by Mrs. Bilquis Saheba, wife of the Late Khan Bahadur Moulvi Mohammed Saheb.
2. The corpus of the Endowment shall consist of a sum of Rs, 1,000/- (Rupees one thousand only) in cash invested in fixed deposit with any Bank decided by the Executive Council of the Southern India Education Trust bearing interest at not less than 10% per annum.

3. The income derived from the Endowment shall be utilized for the award of two prizes annually to the students of the Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women who pass the Autonomous Degree Examination securing the 1st and 2nd highest mark in Home Management at the B.Sc. Home Science Examination held by the College.
4. The Prize shall be awarded to the students annually on the occasion of the Convocation Day Celebrations.
5. The prize shall be awarded in the shape of useful books or other articles of use of permanent value.
6. The Executive Council of the Southern India Education Trust shall be competent to alter or modify the terms of the Endowment at their discretion, if circumstances justify the same.

A-19 Ms. Vasantha Endowment / Vasantha Memorial Prize Endowment

1. This Prize Endowment has been instituted by Mr. V. Sundara Rajan in memory of his daughter Mrs. Vasantha Raghavan (a former student of the College).
2. The corpus of the Endowment is a sum of Rs. 1,000/- (Rupees one thousand only) invested in any bank decided by the S.I.E.Trust.
3. The interest derived shall be utilized for the award of a medal to the student securing the highest marks in the B.A. Degree Examination in Economics.
4. The prize is to be awarded annually at the Convocation Day Celebrations.

A-20 Mrs. & Mr. Md. Khader Hussain Sayeed Endowment

1. This Endowment will be known as the Mr. & Mrs. Khader Hussain Sayeed Scholarship Endowment for Mathematics.
2. The corpus of this Endowment will be a sum of Rs. 2,000/- (Rupees two thousand only) which may be augmented, if so desired, at any time in the future.
3. This corpus of Rs. 2,000/- will remain invested in fixed deposit to yield 10% interest per annum with the Bank of Baroda.

4. The interest so derived will be awarded by way of a Scholarship to the students of Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women who take Mathematics as Part III and Urdu as Part II in the Degree Course in the Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women on the College Day.
5. The Scholarship will be tenable for a period of three years provided the awardee passes each year of the B.Sc. Course in a creditable manner in the first attempt itself.
6. If this condition is not fulfilled the Scholarship will be forfeited and the amount will be added to the corpus.
7. It will be within the competence of the Governing Body of the College to alter or modify the terms herein contained consistent with the objects of the Endowment.

A-21 Haji Nawab Muhammed Mahmood Sahib Endowment

1. This Endowment is created by
 - (a) Mr. Ikram Mahmood, B.A., (Hon) B.L. Advocate
 - (b) Mrs. Sayeed Fathima, B.A.
 - (c) Mrs. Niyaz Fathima, B.A.
 - (d) Mr. Bilal Mahmood and
 - (e) Miss Nazhath Fathima, M.Sc.

In the name of their father the Late Haji Nawab Muhammed Mahmood Sahib, B.A., B.L., Advocate.

2. The corpus of the Endowment consists of a sum of Rs. 1 ,500/- (Rupees one thousand and five hundred only) invested in the Triplicane Urban Co-operative Bank Ltd., in the fixed deposit fetching an income of 1/3 % per annum for a period of 61 months in the first instance.
3. The income derived from this investment will be awarded by way of Scholarship to a deserving Muslim orphan woman student studying in B.A. Economics course in Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women after qualifying herself in the entrance examination to enable her to pursue her studies for a period of three years.

- 4 . While awarding the Scholarship to an orphan Muslim Woman student, on the College Day, preference will be given to a student belonging to the Carnatic family having regard to means and merit of the student.
5. In case a member of the Carnatic family is not available it will be awarded to a poor and deserving orphan Muslim woman student of any other section of the Muslim Community.
6. This Scholarship is tenable for a period of three years. It shall be granted to a student once in three years. It will be awarded on the basis of the awardee passing the Autonomous End Semester Examination in all years and showing good progress in her academic performance.
7. In case there is no deserving Muslim orphan student it will be given to a poor and deserving Muslim woman student of the said class.
8. The award shall be given by the Executive Council of the S.I.E. Trust after giving sufficient publicity to the terms of the award in the beginning of the academic year.
9. If the award is not given in any one year, the interest accrued will be added to the corpus of the endowment.
10. The Executive Council of the S.I.E. Trust shall be competent and have the power to alter the terms in order to achieve the objective of the Endowment as it thinks fit and proper.
11. After the award is given, intimation should be sent to the first of the Founders of the Endowment giving particulars of the candidate who has been awarded the Scholarship.

A-22 Mr. Md. Jalaluddin Kokan & Ayesha Kokan (Fee) Scholarship

1. This Endowment is created by Dr. Nayeem Sheriff, M.D., a citizen of U.S.A., the daughter of the late Md. Jalaluddin Kokan Saheb & Ayesha Kokan of Madras to perpetuate their memory. The donor is a medical practitioner at Chicago, U.S.A.
2. The corpus of the Endowment consists of a sum of \$ 8,000 or its equivalent in Indian Currency.
3. The income derived from the investment is to be utilized for the award of scholarships to deserving Muslim women students either in the Day or in the Afternoon Session.

4. The awardees should be students of Degree Course in Mathematics (3 from Forenoon Session & 3 from Afternoon Session).
5. The award of the Scholarship should be Rs. 2000/- per person and can be awarded to one or more students from the income derived from the investment of \$ 8000/-.
6. The Executive Council of the S.I.E. Trust together with the consent of Dr. Nayeem Sheriff or her representative shall be the competent authority to award the Scholarship on the recommendation of the Principal of Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women. If the donor is unable to attend the meeting, she may nominate a representative to attend the meeting.
7. The Scholarship shall be tenable from year to year subject to satisfactory progress being maintained by the awardee. A student awarded this Scholarship shall not hold any other Scholarship simultaneously.
8. If in any year the Scholarship is not awarded, the amount not utilized shall be added to the Corpus.
9. The Executive Council of the S.I.E. Trust shall communicate to the donor, Dr. Nayeem Sheriff, M.D. at 5 North Old Creek Road, Palos Park, Illinois 60464, Chicago, U.S.A., the particulars of the students to whom the Scholarship is awarded from year to year and also report about the progress made by the awardees in their studies.
10. The Executive Council shall be competent at any time it deems fit and proper, to alter the terms of this Endowment in consultation with the Donor or her authorized representative.
11. The Prize is awarded on the College Day.

A-23 Janab Abdul Razack Scholarship Endowment

1. This Endowment is founded by Professor Meherunnisa Begum, in memory of her Late Uncle Abdur Razack Saheb.
2. The amount of the Endowment is Rs. 1,500/- (Rupees one thousand and five hundred only) and is vested with the Chairman, S.I.E. Trust, Chennai - 18.
3. Scheme of award : The Endowment Scholarship will be called the Janab Abdur Razack Endowment Scholarship tenable in the Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women, Chennai 18.

4. The amount should be deposited in the Triplicane Co-operative Bank Ltd., Triplicane, Chennai, in fixed deposit and the Scholarship should be given from the annual interest accruing on the fixed deposit in the form of a cash grant to the student.
5. The Scholarship should be awarded to the poorest deserving Muslim student studying in the first year of the M.A. Degree Class in English Language and Literature in Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women, Chennai, and will be continued to be given on the College Day to the same student till she completes the course in the College without fail.
6. In the event of the recipient discontinuing her studies, the Scholarship should be paid to the next poorest deserving Muslim girl studying in the first year of the M.A. Degree Class in English Language and Literature.
7. The award is to be made purely on grounds of poverty, irrespective of the fact whether she is in receipt of any other financial assistance.
8. The Chairman of Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women, in consultation with the College Council, will be the sole administrator of the above mentioned Endowment Scholarship and the decision of the administrator shall be final. Under any unforeseen circumstances, if this award is not utilized in a particular year the interest accrued therefrom may be added to the corpus of the fund.

A-24 Tiruchi District Chamber of Commerce, Endowment

1. This Prize Endowment is instituted by the Tiruchi District Chamber of Commerce, Tiruchi.
2. The Endowment consists of a sum of Rs. 1,000/- (Rupees one thousand only).
3. The corpus of the Endowment shall be deposited under the Fixed Deposit Scheme of the Bank of Baroda in the names of the President, Tiruchirapalli District Chamber of Commerce and the Principal, Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women, Chennai.
4. The Fixed Deposit receipt issued by the said Bank shall be kept and retained by the Principal of the College under safe custody.

5. Interest accruing from the above fixed deposit shall be utilized for awarding a Prize only in the form of books to the student of the Final year B.Com. Course of the College, who gets the most meritorious rank in the B.Com. Degree Examination annually to be awarded on the Convocation Day.
6. Interest accruing on the Fixed Deposit amount shall be drawn annually both by the President of the Chamber of Commerce and the Principal of the College for distribution as Prize.
7. Subsequent renewals of fixed deposit shall be made in the joint name as aforesaid and for periods to be agreed upon.

A-25 Indian Psychological Association, M.G.J.

1. The Endowment has been instituted by the Indian Psychological Association, Chennai on the occasion of its Golden Jubilee.
2. The Endowment consists of a sum of Rs. 2,000/- (Rupees two thousand only).
3. The corpus of the Endowment shall be deposited under fixed deposit scheme on a long term basis as may be decided by the Management of the College.
4. The annual income derived by way of interest shall be utilized for the award of a medal or prize to the student securing the First Rank in the M.A. Degree Examination in Applied Psychology in Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women, Chennai.
5. The medal and / or prize shall be awarded on the occasion of the "Convocation Day" Function in the College.
6. The Executive Council of the S.I.E. Trust shall be competent to alter the terms of the Endowment at any time in consultation with the Donor Association or its authorized representative.

A-26 Dr. M.A.M. Ramaswamy (Sports) Endowment

1. This Prize Endowment is instituted by Dr. M.A.M. Ramaswamy, Pro - Chancellor of the Annamalai University for encouraging students of Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women who distinguish themselves in sports and games.
2. The corpus of the Endowment consists of a sum of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand only) in cash invested in fixed deposit with any nationalized bank.

3. The income derived from the Endowment shall be utilized for the award of two prizes each year to the students of Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women, Chennai. One prize to a student distinguishing herself in games and another prize to the student who distinguishes herself in Athletics at the College Annual Sports Meet.
4. The Prize will be awarded to the student annually on the occasion of the College Day Celebrations.
5. The unutilized portion of the annual income shall be added to the corpus of the Endowment.
6. The Executive Council of the Southern India Education Trust shall be competent to alter or modify the terms of the Endowment at their discretion if and when circumstances justify the same.

A-27 Major M.A. Munthakhim Endowment

1. The above Endowment has been instituted by Mr. Md. Fazullah in memory of his father, Major M.A. Munthakhim.
