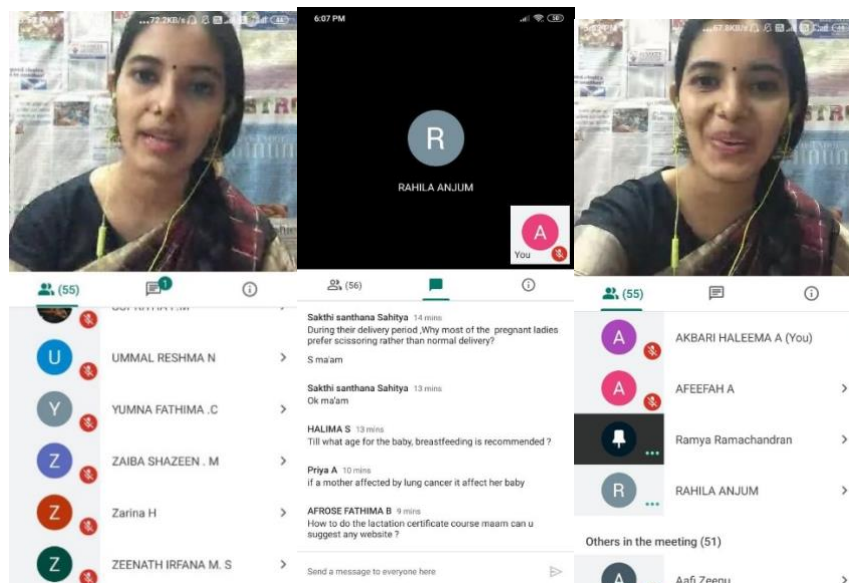

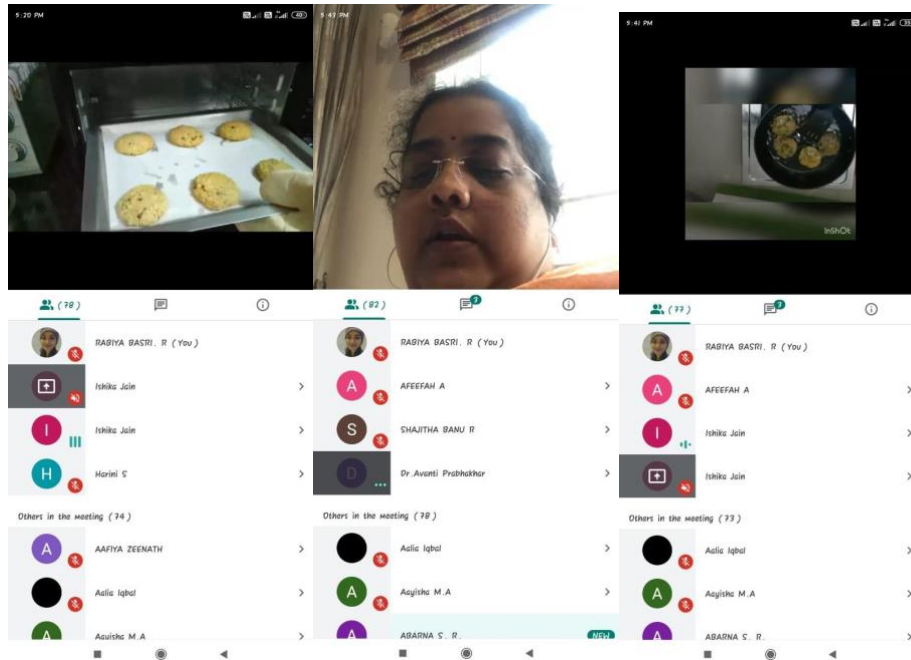
## **DEPARTMENT OF MATHEMATICS (FN)**

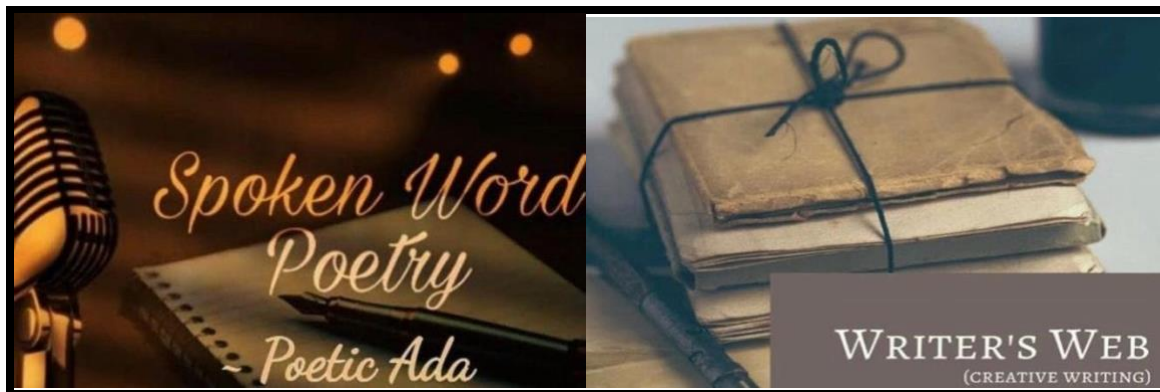

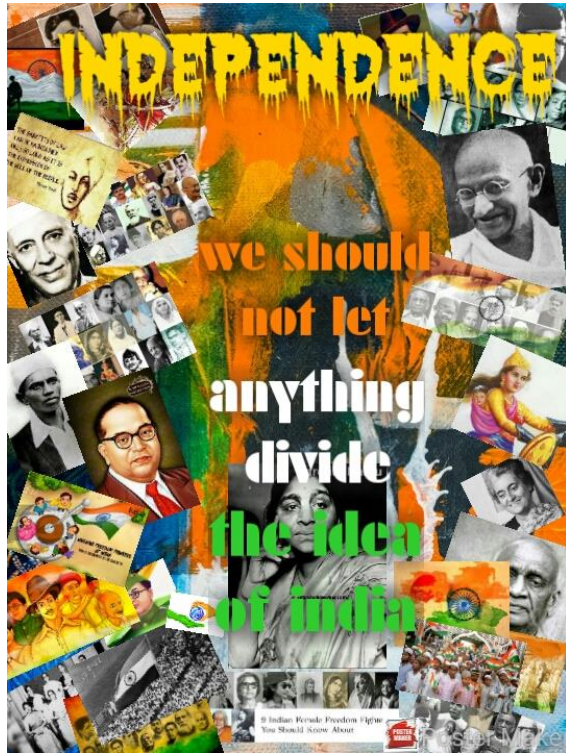

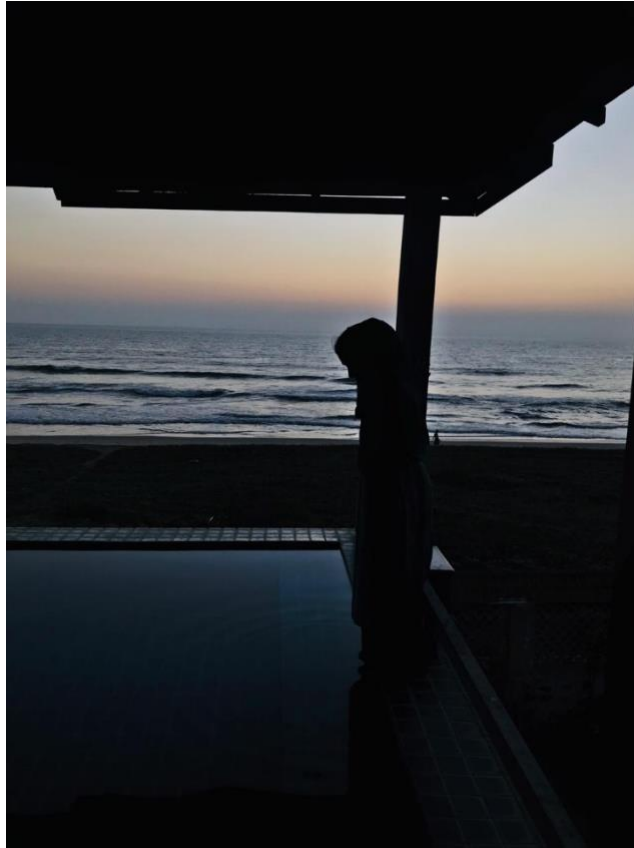
